VALLEJO DOWNTOWN STREETScape PROJECT PHASE 3: CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULED TO BEGIN

VALLEJO, CA – Construction is anticipated to begin Tuesday, October 13, 2015, for the Vallejo Downtown Streetscape Project, Phase 3. Construction is anticipated to last seven months, but could be extended in the event of unforeseen conditions and inclement weather.

As with any construction project, there will be disruptions to the public. In order to minimize these inconveniences, temporary localized traffic control, pedestrian wooden “bridges” or ramps will be implemented. As an example, wooden bridges/ ramps will connect entrances of various businesses to the street in order to maintain access during the demolition of the existing sidewalks.

The contractor will notify property owners via “door hangers” and construction signs prior to and during the course of construction. A minimum of one lane will remain open during construction, only when. Public notices and social media will be further utilized to inform the public of construction activities and progress.



Project Description:

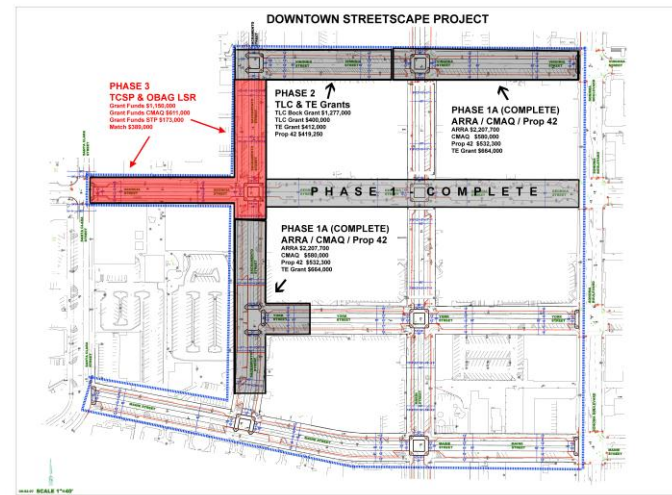
The Downtown Streetscape Improvement Project includes streetscape and landscape beautification within a 14-block area bounded by Sonoma Boulevard to the east, Virginia Street to the north, Sacramento Street to the west and Maine Street to the south. The project seeks to revitalize the downtown with transit oriented high density housing and commercial activities in a pedestrian oriented friendly environment.

Construction of the first phase of the project was completed in July 2011. Phase 2 included improvements along Sacramento Street between Georgia Street and Virginia Street. Construction of the second phase of the project was completed in July 2013.

The Downtown Streetscape Phase 3 Project includes improvements to Sacramento Street from Virginia to Georgia, and Georgia Street from Sacramento to Santa Clara, including the intersection of Sacramento and Georgia Streets.

Amenities include street furniture, signage, decorative paving, street lighting, pavement reconstruction, removal and replacement of curb, gutter and sidewalk, and storm drainage modifications within the public streets. The improvements conform to the vision, goals, and requirements described in the Downtown Vallejo Design Guidelines, Downtown Vallejo Specific Plan, and the Downtown Specific Plan and Virginia Street Development EIR.

A combination of Federal grant, local match and utility contributions make up the funding for this project.



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
