



THE COMMUNITY

The City of Vallejo is located in Solano County and has a population of approximately 125,000 residents. Vallejo is a rapidly changing, highly diverse community located midway between the cities of Sacramento and San Francisco. It is a friendly, active waterfront community that attracts innovative, hardworking people and takes great pride in its history and maritime heritage. Residents of Vallejo are situated to take advantage of the best of what the area has to offer. Golf, museums, performing arts boutique shopping, brewpubs and a wide selection of restaurants are all available in Vallejo. Residents and visitors alike enjoy Vallejo's delightful historical downtown area, weekly downtown farmer's market, and beautifully restored Victorian homes and business facades. Vallejo is also home to Six Flags Discovery Kingdom, one of America's only combination wildlife, oceanarium and theme parks.

CITY GOVERNMENT

Vallejo is a full service, charter city with a fiscal year 2023-2024 total budget of over \$302 million, with a General Fund of approximately \$132 million. The City has an authorized staff of 671 FTEs in the following areas: Administration (Finance, Human Resources, Information Technology), Operations (Police, Fire, Public Works, Water Utilities), Community and Economic Development, City Manager's Office and City Attorney's Office. Vallejo has a Council-Manager form of government with the Mayor and Six-Council Members elected in districts, on a non-partisan basis, for four-year overlapping terms.

THE DEPARTMENT

The Vallejo Water Department is a dynamic organization engaged in growth and positive change for the benefit of our customers and community. The Department provides potable water to 121,000 customers through a highly complex system including multiple raw water sources, three treatment plants, a Sludge Dewatering Facility, 600 miles of distribution pipes, 8 pressure zones, 27 pump stations, and 37,000 service connections. Vallejo Water is a Treatment-5/Distribution-5 system. In 2017, Vallejo water services transitioned from a division of Public Works, to a standalone Water Department reporting directly to the City Manager. This change gives drinking waterrelated operations and issues greater visibility and strategic direction for the benefit of ratepayers. The Water Department's strategic goals include: infrastructure reliability, public trust, sustainability, organizational performance, and financial viability.


THE POSITION

The individual in this position will primarily be assigned to the Water Department, however, the position maybe rotated or assigned to other city departments like City Hall or Public Safety as determined through operational needs. The individual in this position will be working on cutting edge, state of the art technologies and will also be involved in many crucial exciting future infrastructure projects to keep the Vallejo Water Department updated and ensure the mission of uninterrupted water supply is achieved for the Vallejo Water Department customers.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal Information Systems Manager candidate for the City of Vallejo Water Department will possess extensive experience in managing information systems and providing technical support to end users. They will possess superior skills in installing, troubleshooting, maintaining hardware and software, and have a proven track record in developing and implementing IT policies and goals. They will also need to excel in working with employees at all levels of the department and who have a range of varying skill levels relative to technology and applications. Strong management, strategic planning, and communication skills are essential.

Any combination of education and/or experience that has provided the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary to perform the duties of the job is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills, and abilities would be: a bachelor's degree in computer science or a related field, relevant certifications, and five years of experience in information systems management and networking, preferably in public sector.
